

# MINOR IN JOURNALISM

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The journalism minor is designed to expose students to modern storytelling methods. Students learn how to write for broadcast and digital platforms, report news stories, and can choose electives in areas of interest such as digital and online journalism, video and broadcast, mobile, social media, data visualization, audio and podcasting, photojournalism, print media, and more. The minor's mission is to prepare journalism professionals who are superior storytellers who can effectively report on stories that impact people's lives in a positive way.

Students wishing to minor in journalism must complete 18 credits.
