FRATERNITY AND SORORITY LIFE

Currently, over 18 percent of Quinnipiac undergraduate students are members of the 23 fraternities and sororities on campus. The Office of Fraternity & Sorority Life is committed to advancing fraternities and sororities through intellectual and interpersonal development within the Quinnipiac University community and beyond. The office is guided by a set of shared values, known as "pillars," which shape all community programming and initiatives from the new member experience through Commencement.

The pillars are:

- · Leadership through strength of character
- · Growth through intellectual excellence
- · Service through civic engagement
- · Community through diversity and inclusion

The office provides signature programs that exemplify the values of the community, such as the Fraternal Leadership Series, Officers Training Academy, Foundations: New Member Experience, Social Event Manager Training, and more.

Staff in the Office of Fraternity & Sorority Life offer advisement, programming and experiences that are intended to complement the numerous occasions for leadership and involvement provided by individual chapters and their respective governing councils. These experiences afford students opportunities to gain proficiency in the Campus Life learning outcomes.

Students have the opportunity to join a wide variety of organizations including those belonging to the National Panhellenic Conference, National Pan-Hellenic Council, National Association of Latino Fraternal Organizations and North American Interfraternity Conference.

Quinnipiac also has chapters of national honor societies for fraternity/sorority students: Order of Omega, Rho Lambda and Gamma Sigma Alpha. Order of Omega is an academic and leadership honor society. Juniors and seniors with a GPA above or equal to the all-fraternity/sorority GPA can seek membership in Order of Omega. Rho Lambda honors those women within the sorority community who have exhibited the highest qualities of leadership and service to the FSL community and their sorority and possess a 2.50 GPA or higher. Gamma Sigma Alpha is an academic honor society open to fraternity/sorority members who are juniors or above and have earned at least a 3.50 cumulative GPA.
